BASE CONCEPT

- Predominantly residential development but with a mixed and varied canal edge including non-residential / active ground floor uses where development forms a gateway towards the town centre
- Area 2 largely presents opportunities for development along one side of the canal but should be sensitive to existing development and uses on the opposite bank (e.g. existing residential amenity)





APPLICATION OF KEY PRINCIPLES: MOVEMENT

- Urban structure orientated to emphasise strong, clear and safe onward pedestrian and cyclist friendly connections between town centre and canal
- Routes aligned to maximise views towards canal and waterside spaces, creating a dynamic geometry where linear connections meet the curving canal.








Buildings of greater height and more robust massing clustered to canal edge




Domestic residential formats with a higher density urban character based on a linear perimeter block

- 1 Taller buildings creating definition and backdrop to principal space, and scaled to recognise transition towards town centre
- 2 Step down to a more domestic scale, but buildings maintaining an urban character, stepping forward towards, fronting and defining a linear canal space

APPLICATION OF KEY PRINCIPLES: FORM (1 OF 2)

- Clustering buildings towards the canal edge: a linear corridor of higher density development but with composed massing sensitive to adjacent residential areas.
- Potential for residential density of c60dph, with highest densities orientated towards the canal edge.






Linear canal edge corridor creating a dynamic, varied sequence of buildings and spaces gradually lowering in height and density



BASE CONCEPT

- Residential development creating an open, fully public character to western bank allowing full pedestrian and cyclist access to canal and tow path.
- A more private east bank (no tow path), but with a bold urban form fronting and defining thee canal space

Some parts of east bank characterised by private communal gardens, but carefully planned to present a coordinated appearance to views from west bank

Marginal aquatic planting and/or habitat rafts to create a softer, semi-natural character







APPLICATION OF KEY PRINCIPLES: MOVEMENT

- Varied formal and informal routes gathering towards the canal edge, maximising links, views and animation.
- Deformed grid structure references Bootle's traditional urban structure but allows for some variation and informality nearer to the canal edge.


Selective use of larger built forms, e.g. located to provide definition and enclosure of green space adjacent to canal

Potential for occasional active ground floor use to enhance interface with main public spaces / routes

Principal elevations and terraces designed to maximise opportunities for natural surveillance over all public spaces and canal, including balconies etc.

APPLICATION OF KEY PRINCIPLES: FORM

Limited application of larger scaled principal frontage, deployed at selected locations to complement adjacent spaces and key views

Largely consistent height profile composed across the canal, with exception of selected landmark locations. Variation in roof line, balancing pitched angles and horizontal parapets giving localised, human scale detail and an animated skyline

Fined grained vertical emphasis to be integrated within elevational composition, giving rythym and depth to the long elevation

Selected elevations and corners emphasised with distinctive design features in response to forward views
